Building Design

The exterior of the building is designed to blend with the architectural heritage of the community. The same exterior materials were used on it and the adjacent new elementary (Legend Elementary) in order to create a cohesive campus setting.

The two-story school is organized utilizing grade-level wings connected to a main street. This main street accommodates the large assembly spaces and the mutually-used areas including the gym, locker rooms, media center, administrative and counseling offices, music room, stage and dining area.

Artwork

Bowerston Shale Company graciously donated a brick sculpture that is located in the main entrance of the facility. The piece, sculpted by local artist, Allen Moran, embodies the heritage of Newark.

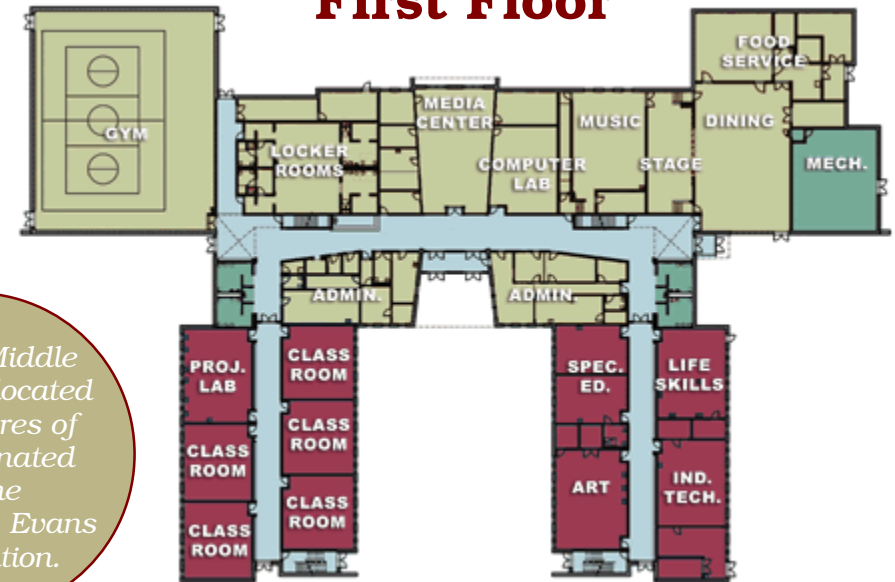

Academics

- 28 teaching stations.
- Standard classrooms are 875 square feet. Other spaces include:

 - Gymnasium - 6,645 square feet
- Wireless technology capability available throughout the building.
- The sixth grade students will be located on the first floor with seventh and eighth grade students on the second floor.
